He once said: *"We must treat our people with dignity and respect. We must listen to them and learn from them."* In those few words lies the very foundation of a just society, and indeed, the ethos we aspire to here at the Vaal University of Technology (VUT).

Through our collaboration with the Sisulu Foundation, we affirm our belief that universities are not ivory towers. They are instruments of social justice, designed not to isolate thought but to inspire action. This partnership is not symbolic. It is strategic, it is sincere, and it is urgent.

In alignment with the enduring legacy of Walter Sisulu, I am pleased to announce that the university will soon launch a student essay competition, inviting our young thinkers to reflect on the values he stood for and how they resonate today. Further details of the competition will

be communicated in due course. This is our way of ensuring that his story continues to live through the voices of the next generation.

To each of you here, I say thank you for your presence.

May your spirits be stirred.

May your convictions be deepened.

And may Walter Sisulu's legacy continue to live, not just in memory, but in movement.
